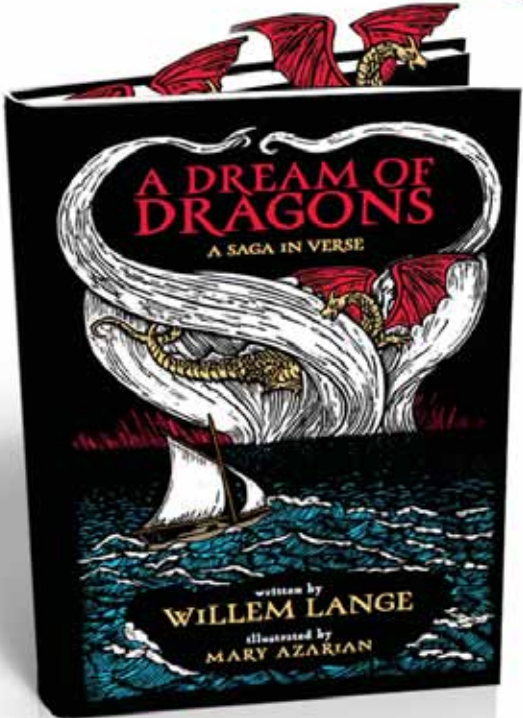
Our second spring title, **Organic Gardening (Not Just) in the Northeast: A Hands-On-Month-to-Month Guide** is also the

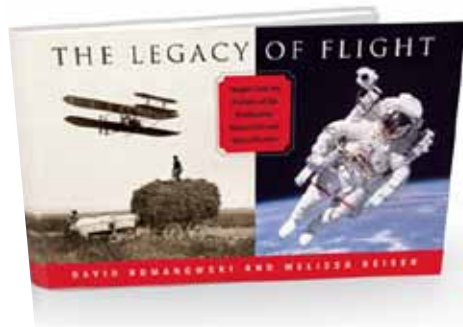

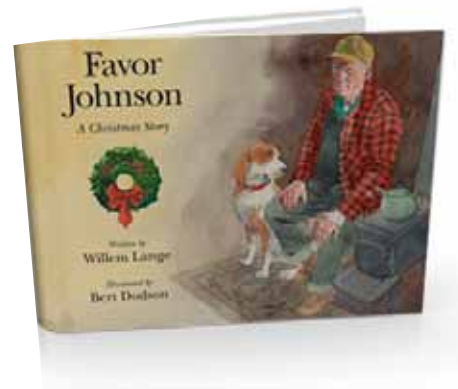
